MARIAN PROCESSION

As this month is dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary, it is fitting that we celebrate the month with a Marian Procession.

Marian processions first began in the 4th Century, however there is a Biblical foundation for such processions. In the Old Testament we read about the carrying of the Ark of the Covenant (2Samuel 6) into Jerusalem in a grand procession, instituted by King David. Indeed, our Church Fathers saw the link between the Ark of the Covenant, which held the Word of God (The Ten Commandments given by God on Mt. Sinai to Moses), and Mary bearing the Word of God, Jesus, in her virginal womb. Hence, the early Church, through inculturation, used processions to show something of the mystery of faith and also enthuse and animate Catholics to show their identity as believers.

Our Marian Procession will seek to show our Catholic identity and pride that we have in our faith; be a prayerful presence as we walk through the streets of Royton and Shaw; and galvanise our parishes as we move towards amalgamating.
