ALL SAINTS

The Solemnity of All Saints is a reminder of the life we are called to live. In the scriptures Jesus commands us to be "merciful as your Heavenly Father is merciful" (Lk. 6:36); "perfect as your Heavenly Father is perfect" (Mt. 5:48). Jesus would never command us to do something that would be impossible. The common denominator in both of Jesus' commands is a person: Father God. If we keep developing our relationship with God we will be merciful, perfect, saintly people.
