OUR LADY OF WALSINGHAM

Circa 1061, The lady of the manor of Walsingham in Norfolk, Richeldis de Faverches, was instructed by a vision of the Virgin Mary to build an exact replica of the house in Nazareth in which the Annunciation had taken place.

The shrine of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Walsingham, was one of the great pilgrimage centres of medieval times. The original house was destroyed at the Reformation, but re-established in 1897 and the Slipper Chapel became the National Shrine in 1943. The Shrine was raised to the rank of Minor Basilica by Pope Francis in 2015.

Devotion to Our Lady of Walsingham is closely tied to the work of ecumenism - dialogue and fraternity with other Christian churches - with the hope of bringing about greater unity.

Our parishes do dialogue with other Christian communities within our area and we seek to do more over the years
