



# SAINT JOSEPH WITH SAINTS AIDAN & OSWALD

### THE LATERAN BASCILICA

The Lateran Basilica was built by the Emperor Constantine on the Lateran Hill in Rome in about 324. The feast of its dedication has been celebrated in Rome on this date since the twelfth century. In honour of the basilica, "the mother and head of all the churches of the City and the World," the feast has been extended to the whole Roman Rite as a sign of unity and love towards the See of Peter, which, as St Ignatius of Antioch said in the second century, "presides over the whole assembly of charity."


Quarant'Ore is an ancient **Gatholic Tradition of spending** time with Jesus in prayer; adoration.


Jesus wishes to feed us with Himself. He who said "I am the Bread of Life", wishes to satisfy and nourish us with His own self.

# **Testimony**

Lourdes, in France, where the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to a young girl - St. Bernadette - is known as a place of healing of infirmities - 72 officially recognised miracles. Most of the miraculous healing took place at exposition and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

All healing - emotional, spiritual, physical - comes through Jesus.



# **Teaching**

"Adoration is the first attitude of man acknowledging that he is a creature before his Creator. It exalts the greatness of the Lord who made us and the almighty power of the Saviour who sets us free from evil. Adoration is homage of the spirit to the "King of Glory," respectful silence in the presence of the "ever greater" God. Adoration of the thrice-holy and sovereign God of love blends with humility and gives assurance to our supplications."

# **Thanksgiving**

Time with The Lord is never wasted. Prayer is when the human person turns to God to express their human nature: Adoration: praising and loving God for He is good and is worthy of praise **Contrition**: sorrow for sins and misdeeds which we regret - for the wrong we do

Thanksgiving: for the blessings and graces we receive from the hand of God Supplication: asking God for our needs and the needs of all the world



### DONA MACHINE

This weekend we introduce the Dona Machine. It is a contactless device which can be used to make a cashless donation - contactless or by using a debit card.

As we became a more cashless society the church would like to make contributions more accessible for people.

The machine works by you entering a chosen amount of money, adding Gift Aid, (if you pay tax) and simply donating via contactless.

### **GIFT AID**

Gift Aid is a free redeemable amount of money we as a parish can claim back from central government. The tax you normally pay is used by the government for various things. You Gift Aiding your tax - donating to the church - is you saying that you want your tax being used by your place of worship. You can Gift Aid what you donate by filling in the forms which will be distributed next week or by using the QR code or Dona machine.
